I am a child of the King, married to Sheila and together we have 2 grown sons who married beautiful talented ladies. We have 7 wonderful grandchildren who (all but 1 grandchild) live here in Abbotsford.

Growing up in southern Manitoba, my 4 brothers and 1 sister did not realize until we were older that we were truly blessed. We had a large supportive extended family, never mind our own strong loving family. My grandfather Friesen was a minister, my uncles were ministers so church has always been a part of my life. We lived on a larger farm and work was always something

that was before us! But we enjoyed it (most of the time)!

On June 14, 1968 at 14 years old while attending a crusade in the local town, I realized that my grandparents or parents faith was not enough. I needed to have a personal faith and gave my life to Jesus that day. Baptism followed a year later and I am thankful that God's grace has been with me ever since. Growing up I loved history, geography and exploring. On November 27, 2000 I had surgery to remove approximately 2/3 of my stomach. It was the day before I went home from the hospital that still is so clear in my memory. That day the doctors came and suggested I would celebrate my 50th birthday but maybe not the 60th!

I went to sleep with that thought and had a dream that was so vivid. In the dream, I was walking in a long tunnel created by bushes or roses, something that was brushing me and poking at me. There seemed to be a light at the end of that tunnel and when I pushed through (as I recall) with considerable effort, I saw Someone standing at the end who said "you will be all right". This person was the Light! Chemo and radiation forced a strength that I could not do on my own. It was so

tough and now more than 22 years later, I still get emotional thinking that through. Through it all, God's faithfulness and the prayers of family and church carried Sheila and myself.

Since 2002, we have called South Abbotsford Church our church home and are blessed to be part of a loving supportive Life Group, enjoy playing pickleball, riding our e-bikes and going for picnics. The Lord is faithful and good!
